## Role of CERT:



- Prepare citizens to respond to and cope with the aftermath of a disaster by;
- supplement first responders, civilians can be recruited and trained as teams that, in essence, will be auxiliary responders.
- These groups can provide immediate assistance to victims in their area;
- organize spontaneous volunteers who have not had the training;
- collect disaster intelligence.

# An Unmanned Aircraft is an Aircraft that Must Comply with Safety Requirements

- (1) Capable of sustained flight in the atmosphere;**
- (2) Flown within visual line of sight of the person operating the aircraft;** and
- (3) Flown for hobby or recreational purposes.**

**Flight restrictions are used to protect, but are not limited to, special security events, sensitive operations (e.g., select Law Enforcement activity, space flight operations, etc.), and Presidential movement. # Commercial and Other Non-Model Aircraft UAS Operations

- 1) **14 C.F.R. Part 107**: The new regulatory framework enables certain small UAS operations for commercial and other non-hobby purposes. The rule addresses airspace restrictions, remote pilot certification, and operational limits. # What is “Map Your Neighborhood?”

- Build Disaster Readiness among Neighbors
- Neighbors that are prepared:
  - Saves Lives
  - Reduce severity of injuries and trauma.
  - Reduce property damage
  - Work as a team to strengthen communities.
  - Improve their quality of life.



# What is “Map Your Neighborhood?”

- Nine (9) Steps to take immediately following a disaster.
- Develop a neighborhood skills and equipment inventory.
- Map your neighborhood to identify areas of concern: water, gas, electricity, elderly and special needs.





# Preview of MYN

- Shingles – 9 Steps to prepare your neighborhood.
  - Meeting in a private home
  - Invite 15-20 of your immediate neighbors
  - For Example- afternoon for 2-4 hours
  - Steps 1-6 – Take care of yourself, your family and your home.
  - Steps 7-9 – Meet up, teams, survey, report.



# Preview of MYN

- Shingles – Go home with your neighbors.
  - Includes a Map of each home, shutoffs, hazards.
  - Window signs – “HELP” or “OK”
- DVD – Step-by-step for discussion and planning by your neighbors.
- Steps 7-9 – include a walking tour of your neighborhood to make the Map.



# Why is it important??

- Emergency or Disaster???
- Evacuation or Shelter in place??
- Nobody is prepared!
- Your neighbor's problem is also your problem!
- Shared resources for the benefit of all.
- Cooperation, Communication, Care

# What is the BIG Deal??

- 1690 – 1857 – 1906 Major Quakes
- Magnitudes 7.0+ for 2-6 Minutes
- Multiple Faults –Sequentially or Together
- No Hurricanes, Tornados, 100 yr. Floods
- No practice – No training?
- Recovery – You, Family, Neighborhood and Local Small Business



# This is the BIG Deal??

- Landers – 6 min., 6 fault traces, shake 2 yrs.
- When, not IF!! WGCEP 2008 Report
  - 31% on San Jacinto Fault
    - “Tectonic Time Bomb”- Greatest Seismic Risk
  - 59% of 6.7+ on Section of San Andreas
    - 12+ Moderate quakes since 1935
    - 5-7 Major quakes in the last 1,100 years.
  - Chucamonga to the Raymond Fault
